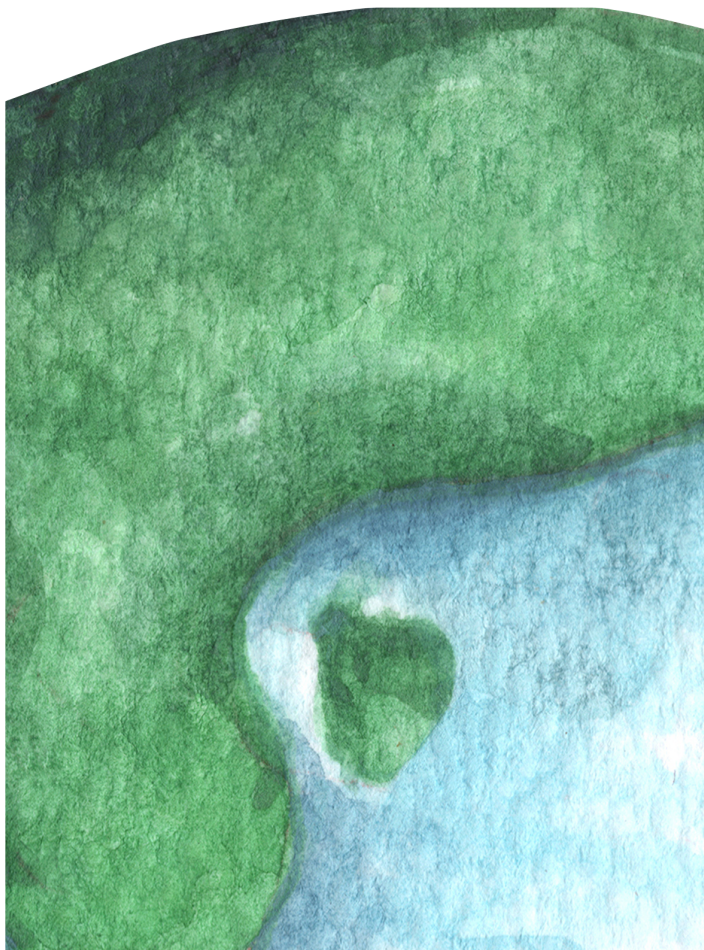

Stories that Andi will share are The Three Sister's Story, Oneida; Turtle Island Story, Anishinaabe, and the Great Race, Lakota.

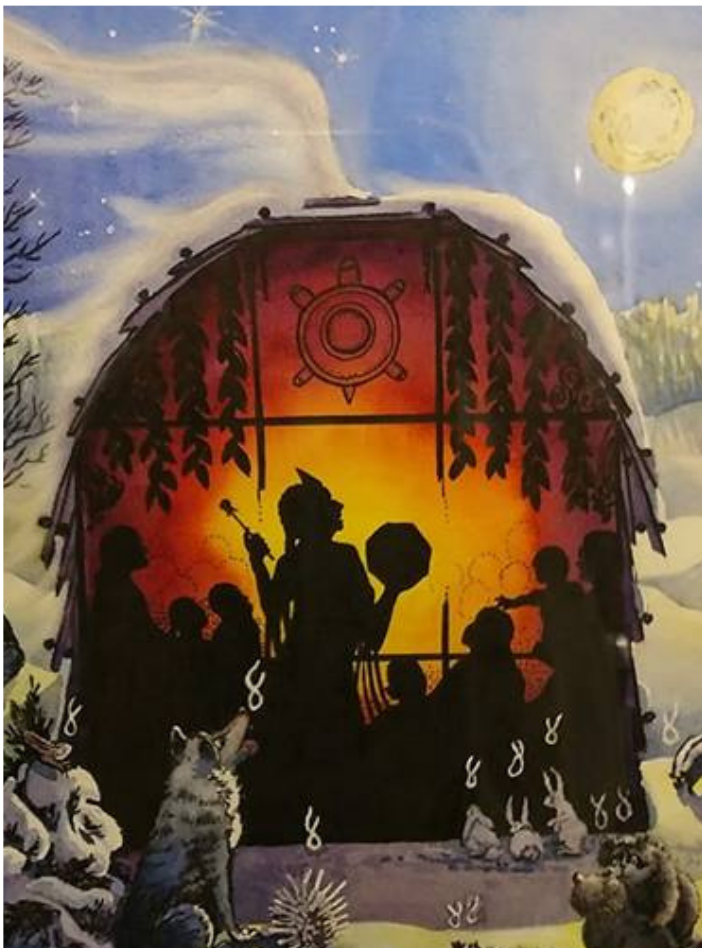
