





# Cataloging and Digitization of Digital Heritage Items

### 1. Cataloging

- Developed a catalog to accommodate the variety of needs of the collection
- ~900 videos processed

### 2. Digitization

- ~4o videos reviewed and digitized –still a work in progress
- -800 documents cataloged and digitized to date



## Cataloging and Digitization

### **AV** materials

- ~400 VHS
- ~150 MiniDV
- ~200 cassettes
- ~200 DVCAM
- ~30 reels (various sizes)

Curriculum materials
~6 filing cabinets full of a variety of papers and bound books

### 2017

### 1. Cataloging


Developed from scratch with ~30 metadata fields; Fixed set of document types ~300 videos processed, including originals and DVD copies Labels designed, updated, and organized

### 2. Digitization

Only 1 station to do digital capture - runs at real time Researched digitization methods to account for all materials

### 3. Conversion to Cloud storage

Researched & discussed options, e.g. Dropbox vs. in-house server Issues of checksum – needs to be conducted annually



### 2018

- 1. Cataloging
  - ~700 videos processed, originals and DVD copies
- 2. Digitization
  - Researched digitization methods
  - Began digitization process of AV materials
  - ~40 DVDs digitized
- 3. Conversion to Cloud storage

All paper documents are converted to OCR PDF as they enter the catalog

~800 documents cataloged and digitized to date

4. Review of AV materials by Eminent Speakers/Apprentices ~50 videos reviewed by elders






### Archiving/ Cataloging

### Elder Team

- Check for continuity issues for all audio/video content •
- Check quality of all audio and video recordings (any • "remastering" required?)
- Isolate useable content of each set of recordings, written material
- Continue adding audio, video and written entries into the • master catalog using existing process and procedures
- Continue archiving audio, video and written material •
- Viewing, transcribing/notetaking audio and video recordings with a team of elders
- Take notes, transcribe recordings, make recordings of • interactions or recollections, stories
- Add notes to master catalog

Basic technology literacy classes aimed at seniors, covering topics such as texting, streaming media, and password management. Handouts from the classes are available as templates for other libraries to adapt.








## D. R. Moon Memorial Library

Partnered with elders and teachers in local Old Order Mennonite and Amish schools to develop and deliver monthly packets of educational resources.






## Patterson Memorial Library
