- Discuss NPR contest and rules

Block 2 ~Wed., Jan 29 (need 30-40 minutes)

- Share out ideas for their podcast
- Discuss some of the podcasts that you listened to. What did you like? What didn't you like?

- Discuss different structures for podcasts: (solo-commentary, interview style, etc.)
- Discuss the general <u>arc of a story</u> and how to make a story interesting.
- Discuss ideas for getting in other voices (interviewing someone, using clips, etc.)
- Homework:
 - 1. Decide on a topic and find 3-5 sources that will be most helpful to you when crafting your story.
 - 2. Start researching / taking notes on your topic pulling out the most important facts that need to be in your podcast
 - 3. Listen to another podcast of your choice...maybe even try to find one on the topic you have chosen

Block 3 ~ Fri., Jan 31 (need 30-40 minutes)

- LISTEN to these:
- Check in on research--what have they found? Is a story emerging of their topic?
- Short in class activity--draw your story arc.
- Turn in ½ sheet check in with a sketch of their story arc, a list of most important facts and ideas on who / what other voices they could incorporate into their podcasts
- Homework--continue researching--start writing script. Look at example copy of script like this one: <u>https://www.thisamericanlife.org/74/transcript</u> (this is long....we would not copy all of it, just a sample)

Block 4 Mon., Feb 10 (30-40 minutes)

- The equipment! Show them the recording equipment and do a group demonstration on what audio files look like, how you move them around, etc.
- Homework: Using their phones (talk about recording apps they can use), have them pick a question (like "What makes you laugh?") and have them ask 7-10 people this same question, recording it on their phones. Have them bring these files the next time we meet)
- Also, reminding them to keep researching and / or keep working on script

Block 5 Fri., Feb 14 (entire block--87 minutes)

- Quick refresher on recording equipment (?)
- Uploading their audio samples and creating a mini audio story--giving them the entire block to do this editing and then sharing out at the end of class if time.
- Short discussion on the importance / timing of music and sound effects. Discuss what they have already listened to or play a short clip with music / sound effects so they know when to put it in. Discuss where to find free music. Have them go through their scripts and mark when they think music / sound effects might be good--maybe give a document that outlines do's and don'ts of adding music, what type of music to use, etc.
- Sign up for recording time!
- Remind them that if they are doing live or phone interviews that they need to arrange that and make sure the person is available when the equipment is also available!
- Homework: keep working on research, script, interviews, music clips, sound clips, etc.

Block 6 Tues., Feb 18 (30 minutes)

- Script is due! Needs to be recording-ready.
- Have kids who are ready to start recording and / or do a check in to make sure the schedule of when recording is happening is solid.

Recording is happening on their own (or with our support outside of class time).....over a week or more.

Block 7 Tues., Feb 25 - (entire block, 87 minutes)

• All recording must be done by this date

- Entire block for editing / troubleshooting
- Any editing not done in class on this day needs to be finished outside of class.
- Give final due date of project.
